December, the darkest month of the year, is marked by festivals and events around the world, including religious and cultural events where light, usually candles, is featured and prominent. Many festivals and celebrations are known as "Festivals of Light".

Here are some of the celebrations:

Diwali is one of the major religious festivals celebrated by Hindus, Jains, Sikhs, and Buddhists, Also known as the Festival of Lights, Diwali, recently celebrated in November. is notable for the lighting of many candles in temples and homes.

Hanukkah is an 8-day Jewish festival. This year Hanukkah falls between Dec 7and Dec 15 Candles are lit every night and special foods such as latkes are served.

Santa Lucia, December 13, is a religious celebration marked in Scandinavia and Italy. Concerts and processions are highlights of the day. Special foods and candles worn on head-wreaths are featured.

Yule is a festival that has pagan roots and is celebrated by Germanic people across the world. Yuletide technically falls within the Winter Solstice. The Yule log was originally a real tree trunk or limb, and it was burnt on the hearth.

Kwanzaa is a December holiday rooted in African history. often celebrated with traditional African songs, dances, storytelling and poetry reading. Special foods are served daily. The end of the celebration is December 31.

Christmas, December 25, is a religious festival celebrated by Christians to mark the birth of Jesus. This is the most popular December holiday and is often celebrated even by non-Christians. Lights, music, and many special foods are features of the religious celebrations and these vary from culture to culture.

Infection Prevention & Control Update: RSV Immunization



Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) is a major cause of lower respiratory tract infections. Older adults, especially those with other comorbid conditions and underlying health issues such as heart or lung diseases and weakened immune systems, are more susceptible to severe disease and have an increased risk of RSV- related hospitalization and death.

August 4, 2023, Health Canada gave authorization for GSK RSV vaccine, Arexvy. Arexvy is given intramuscularly as a single dose of 0.5ml. The need for future doses is not known currently. This vaccine will not be given along with other vaccines at this time as a precaution. The overall efficacy of the vaccine is 82.6%. Side effects of the vaccine include pain, swelling and redness at the injection site, fever, tiredness, headache, nausea and muscle or joint pain.

For the 2023-2024 RSV season, Ontario has developed an RSV prevention program for adults 60 years and older living in long term care homes. Arexvy will be offered to residents of LTCHs who are eligible. Residents who have consents in place will receive their vaccine during onsite clinics (same process for influenza and COVID-19 vaccine clinics). Consent forms will be sent to families/residents as soon as they are available from MOH.
