Meet Ernesto Ting

Affectionately known as Ernie, became a resident of Markhaven in mid-January of this year. With over 28 years of experience, Ernie served as the Manager of Infrastructure at the Waterworks Department for the City of Markham. Although he holds a degree in Architecture from the University of Santo Tomas in the Philippines, his career spanned most of his professional life in engineering. Ernie is married to his wife, Tessie, for nearly 50 years, and they have two children, Trina (Adam) and Eric, as well as two grandsons, Nolan and Marco. In his later years, Ernie enjoyed playing golf and tennis, while in his retirement, he has become an avid traveler.

Ernie has been part of a group of four couples who have embarked on numerous trips around the world. He served as the group navigator, leading them to various destinations. Some of the places they've visited include safaris in South Africa and Botswana, a river cruise in Russia, the awe-inspiring Machu Picchu, the Galapagos Islands, Iguazu Falls, and Victoria Falls. They've also seen the Egyptian Sphinx, Petra in Jordan, the Great Wall of China, the iconic Sydney Opera House, the majestic Mayon Volcano, Mount Fuji, a bullfight in Spain, and religious pilgrimages to Israel, Italy, Fatima, Lourdes, Medjugorje, and Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Tragically, on January 29, 2024, after a trip to Thailand, Ernie suffered a severe accident that resulted in multiple skull fractures. He spent almost a year in hospitals before relocating to Markhaven. While his initial prognosis was not good somehow he managed to survive. Ernie is definitely a fighter and his family is ever so thankful.

Ernie now enjoys going out with his devoted wife Tessie to eat dim sum, buy toys for his grandkids, and has a great group of friends who come to keep him company. While he can't walk like he used to, it doesn't stop him from living his life and enjoying the small pleasures with his family and friends.

Seasons & Supper

November Harvest Butternut Squash & Apple Soup

Celebrate the bounty of late autumn with this warm, comforting soup ideal for November when squash and apples are plentiful.

INGREDIENTs: (serves-6)

- 1 medium butternut squash (about 1.5 kg), peeled, seeded and cubed
- 2 large apples (e.g., McIntosh or Cortland), peeled, cored and chopped
- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 L vegetable broth (or chicken broth, if preferred)
- 250 mL apple cider (or unsweetened apple juice)
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- ½ tsp ground nutmeg
- Salt & freshly ground black pepper, to taste
- 2 Tbsp olive oil or butter



INSTRUCTIONS:

- Preheat your oven to 400 °F (≈200 °C). Toss the butternut squash cubes with 1 Tbsp olive oil, salt and pepper. Spread them on a baking sheet and roast for about 25-30 minutes, until tender and lightly caramelized.
- Meanwhile, in a large soup pot, heat the remaining 1 Tbsp olive oil (or butter) over medium heat. Add the onion and sauté for ~5 minutes until translucent. Add the garlic and cook 1 more minute until fragrant.
- Add the chopped apples to the onion/garlic mixture and sauté for a few minutes until the apples begin to soften.
- Pour in the vegetable broth and apple cider, then add the roasted squash cubes. Stir in the cinnamon and nutmeg. Bring to a gentle boil, then reduce heat and simmer ~10-15 minutes to let flavours meld.
- Using an immersion blender (or transferring carefully in batches to a countertop blender), purée the soup until smooth and creamy.
- Taste and adjust seasoning: add more salt, pepper, or a pinch more cinnamon if desired.
- Serve hot, with the optional swirl of cream or yogurt and garnishes of roasted pumpkin seeds or fresh herbs.

Tips:

- A swirl of cream or plain yogurt for serving
- Optional garnish: roasted pumpkin seeds, chopped fresh parsley or sage leaves
